UNESCO-Shenzhen Funds-in-Trust Project

The UNESCO-Shenzhen Project on Strengthening Quality Assurance in Higher Education in Africa is a 3-year project implemented since 2017, with an aim to strengthen higher education systems by developing quality assurance mechanisms in 10 African countries: Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Malawi, Mali, Namibia, Niger, Senegal, The Gambia, Togo, and Zambia.







About the project

The UNESCO-Shenzhen Project on **Strengthening Quality Assurance in Higher Education in Africa** was established with support from the People's of
Republic of China and contribution from the Shenzhen Municipal Government.
The overall objective is to strengthen higher education systems at national and
regional levels in African countries by developing quality assurance mechanisms.

The project also complements UNESCO's efforts to facilitate the internationalization of higher education and the implementation of the *Revised Convention on the Recognition of Studies, Certificates, Diplomas, Degrees and Other Academic Qualifications in Higher Education in African States (Addis Convention).*



The overall objective is achieved through:

- Strengthening institutional capacities for quality assurance agencies;
- Supporting the establishment and reforms in national quality assurance systems;
- Raising awareness on the significance of quality assurance in higher education;
- Promoting sharing of best practices in quality assurance and in the recognition of qualifications;
- Facilitating networking of quality assurance agencies and networks in Africa.

Main areas of action

The project supports the establishment of external quality assurance (QA) agencies, strengthens capacity for quality assurance professionals in the 10 beneficiary countries, and reinforces networking in quality assurance on the African Continent with the following three components:



1 Establishment of quality assurance agencies in Côte d'Ivoire, Mali, Niger, and Togo by facilitating access to good practices, developing capacities and supporting networking with existing QA agencies.



II Institutional capacity building of established QA agencies in Egypt, Malawi, Namibia, Senegal, The Gambia, and Zambia by reinforcing capacities of QA professionals, knowledge sharing and development of QA tools.



III Consolidating quality assurance networks in Africa, through cross-fertilization of ideas, sharing of best practices and development of mutual recognition tools in quality assurance.
